Summary of Major Changes to 2024 CDBG Program Design

In 2024, DHCD updated the CDBG Program Design to streamline grant and project processes. The information below summarizes the major changes to the 2024 CDBG Program Design. The table on Page 3 summarizes the updated funding limitations.

The grant application timeline has shifted:

Competitive: April 15 – June 12
Planning Grants: May – November 15
Urgent Need: May – November 15

DHCD has updated CDBG Grant project types:

Competitive Grants now have five primary project types:

1. Economic Development 2. Comprehensive Community Development

• Community Economic Development 3. Community Service Facilities

Business District Revitalization
4. Public Infrastructure

• Local & Regional Innovation 5. Targeted Neighborhood Housing

Open Submission Grants now have five primary project types:

1. Public Services 2. Construction-Ready Water/Sewer (CRWSF)

3. Regional Water/Wastewater 4. Scattered Site Housing Rehabilitation

5. Urgent Need

Planning Grants categories have been updated:

Activation Planning Grants formerly called "Community Organizing Grants", or "Overall Community Needs Assessment Grants" allow for a locality or an organization on behalf of a locality to partner with DHCD to explore future partnership and project possibilities.

Other Planning Grants include:

1. Comprehensive Community Development 2. Housing Rehabilitation

3. Community Service Facilities 4. Public Services

5. Public Infrastructure 6. Regional Projects

7. Business District Revitalization

Planning Grants are **required** for Business District Revitalization projects

Eligibility A locality is eligible to apply for any CDBG project, granted they meet the eligibility requirements for open contracts: 1) localities are allowed a maximum of two (2) active construction or public service projects at once; and 2) localities are below a \$3 million grant award cap. For both Competitive Submission: Targeted Neighborhood Housing Rehabilitation and Open Submission: Scattered Site Housing Rehabilitation project types, the Loan Amortization Periods have changed:
