### **Tropical Storm Helene**

- Tropical Storm Helene struck Virginia between September 25, 2024, and October 3, 2024, causing catastrophic rainfall-triggered flooding.
- On October 1, 2024, the President issued a major disaster declaration for a number of localities in Southwest Virginia.
- In January 2025, HUD announced the allocation of nearly \$12 billion in CDBG-DR funds for communities across 24 U.S. states and territories.





# **CDBG-DR Funding Requirements**

- Help address a direct or indirect impact from the disaster in a county covered by a Presidential disaster declaration
- 2. At least 80% of funds must address needs within the HUD-identified Most Impacted and Distressed (MID) areas
- 3. At least 70% CDBG-DR funded activities must benefit Low/Moderate Income (LMI) Persons







# CDBG-DR Funding in the Commonwealth

Virginia will receive \$46,670,000 in funding to support long-term recovery efforts following Tropical Storm Helene.

- Funding will be prioritized to Giles & Washington Counties, identified as the Most Impacted and Distressed (MID) Areas, per HUD Federal Register Notice.
- DHCD must complete and submit and Action Plan to HUD for approval.
  - This document assesses the unmet needs in the MID areas and proposes funding for activities to address recovery and mitigation.
- There will be opportunities for public comment and input.



# Most Impacted and Distressed (MID) Areas

#### 80% of CDBG-DR funding will be allocated to:

- Giles County, including:
  - Town of Pearisburg
  - Town of Rich Creek
  - Town of Narrows
  - Town of Glen Lyn
  - Town of Pembroke

- Washington County, including:
  - Town of Abingdon
  - City of Bristol
  - Town of Damascus
  - Town of Glade Spring
  - Town of Saltville



#### **Action Plan Overview**

#### Funding awarded as grants to Units of Local Government

- At least 80% of funding will be allocated to Giles County & Washington County
- Up to 20% proposed allocation to other localities within the Helene Disaster Declaration Area

- Housing Recovery & Mitigation Activities
- Infrastructure Recovery & Mitigation Activities
- Economic Revitalization Recovery Activities
- Public Services Recovery Activities





#### **Needs Assessment**



#### Housing

- Primarily owner-occupied housing
- Above-average vacancy rates
- Generally older homes



#### Infrastructure

- Damaged bridges & roads rendered crucial services inaccessible
- Damaged broadband lines
- Water systems compromised



#### **Economic Revitalization**

- Businesses experienced flooding
- o Tourism decreased dramatically

# Rental & Owner-Occupied Housing Recovery Program

~ \$15,000,000 available in funding

#### Eligible activities include:

- Construction of new houses
- Rehabilitation and reconstruction of homes
- Creation or rehabilitation of single family or multifamily units
- Housing activities that benefit either owner-owned homes or rental homes

<u>Note:</u> Properties receiving proceeds from flood insurance may not be eligible for CDBG-DR assistance.

# Infrastructure Recovery Program

~ \$12,000,000 available in funding

#### Eligible activities include:

- Projects involving water, wastewater, and drainage improvements
- Certain community service facilities serving primarily LMI persons, such as health clinics or skill-building facilities for jobs related to disaster recovery
- Street improvements
- Other infrastructure activities as needed and identified in related recovery plans

# **Economic Revitalization Recovery Program**

~ \$4,000,000 available in funding

#### Eligible activities include:

- Development Readiness
- Façade Improvements
- Site Redevelopment
- Small Business Recovery
- Job Creation, Retention, and Training
